



- **CONTRAST**
 - emphasis, dominance
 - Use color/value, size, or isolation
- **Creates a focal point**
 - draw viewer's attention to an area of the design
- **Leads to a hierarchy**
 - Where does the eye go first? Where does it go next?





SCALE


Each circle represents a disease or disorder and is scaled in proportion to the number of genes associated with that disease.





- **ALIGNMENT**
- **Creates associations between elements in a design**
 - **Invisible lines used to position various elements**
 - **Internal grid creates structure for a design**



- **ALIGNMENT**
- **Creates associations between elements in a design**
 - **Invisible lines used to position various elements**
 - **Internal grid creates structure for a design**



- **PROXIMITY**
- We tend to group elements of similar size, shape, and color
 - Perceived as units rather than individual lines or shapes
